We read in the "Foreign Letter": "In many respects the situation in Germany is similar to that in July - August 1918, when hopes of German military leaders for a stalemate had faded and the government was asked to sue for immediate peace." We hope this analysis is true, and the day is near when you will be crossing The Red Bridge, which is shown above.

The mimeographing of the third issue of this news-letter was done by Arlene Hershey, Esther Rogers, Eleanor Eavenson, Roberta Brown, Nellie Bond and the writer, and we turned out 375 Ledgerettes before midnight, so you see our production methods have improved.

Preparation for mailing was done in the basement of the bank, (mimeographing was done in the writer's dining room) and we had quite a few new faces on the assembly line, Mrs. Haines T. Miller stamping and sealing the envelopes.

Longenecker is going to tell us of his experiences as an ambulance driver in Italy, and we want you to know that we are counting upon your co-operation and suggestions to keep this publication alive and appealing. How about sitting right down and giving us some little human interest story today?
